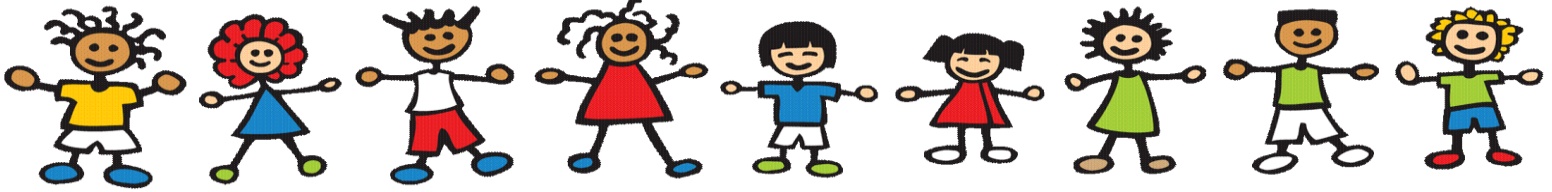


Free and Healthy Meals Summer Food Service Program
